

Americano

Created in Italy during the 1860's, this refreshing, bittersweet cocktail was originally known as the Milano-Turino. It was renamed the Americano after the American expats in Italy who adopted it as their drink of choice during Prohibition.

serves one

- 1 1/2 ounces Campari
- 1 1/2 ounces sweet vermouth
- 1 1/2 ounces chilled club soda
- orange wedge for garnish

1. Pour Campari and vermouth into an ice-filled rocks glass. Top with club soda and garnish with an orange wedge.
